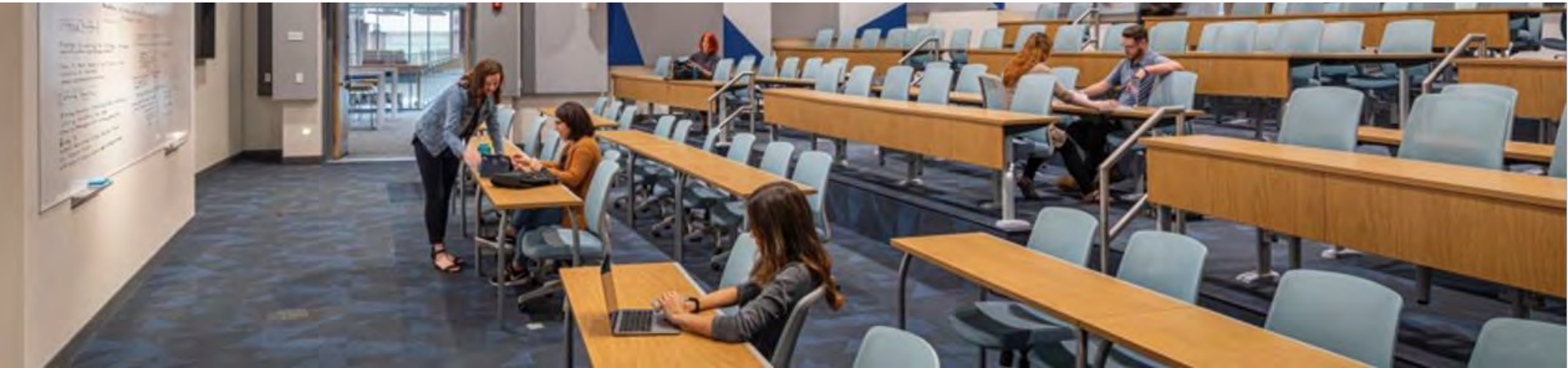

Every course has a syllabus provided in **Canvas**, our learning management platform

- Course expectation
- Class schedule
- Contact information for faculty member
 - Students can contact professors by email but we encourage students to visit their faculty member during office hours, specific time periods for student to visit.



FACULTY FEEDBACK IS PROVIDED TO STUDENTS THROUGHOUT THE SEMESTER.

Students are encouraged to check their progress within the appropriate platforms and communicate regularly with faculty about progress.



Canvas

It is a learning management system (LMS) used by to manage online courses and learning materials. It provides tools for instructors to post course content, assignments, and grades, and for students to access and engage with the course.



Navigate

Allows students to connect with the right people and resources. Students can schedule appointments with teachers or advisors, receive important updates by email or text, and get timely help through academic alerts that activate support services.



Self Service Banner

This is a one-stop hub for academics. Here students register for classes, view schedules, check official grades and transcripts, manage financial aid and payments, update personal information.

Tutoring and Academic Support Center (TASC)

The Tutoring and Academic Support Center (TASC) provides academic content support to University of New Haven students by employing metacognitive strategies, helping students to gain awareness of and apply optimal learning processes in the creative pursuit of becoming independent learners.

TASC tutors focus sessions on discussions and demonstrations of key concepts and processes, using external examples to assist students in grasping and applying material.

The center provides a supportive environment where tutors listen to students' needs and work to provide lessons geared toward individual learning styles.

TASC offers both in-person and online tutoring. Students can make appointments with us through the mobile app for Navigate, the University's scheduling and reporting software. Students may also simply walk into our center on the lower level of the Peterson Library.
