EVERY COURSE COUNTS towards either a major requirement or core requirement.

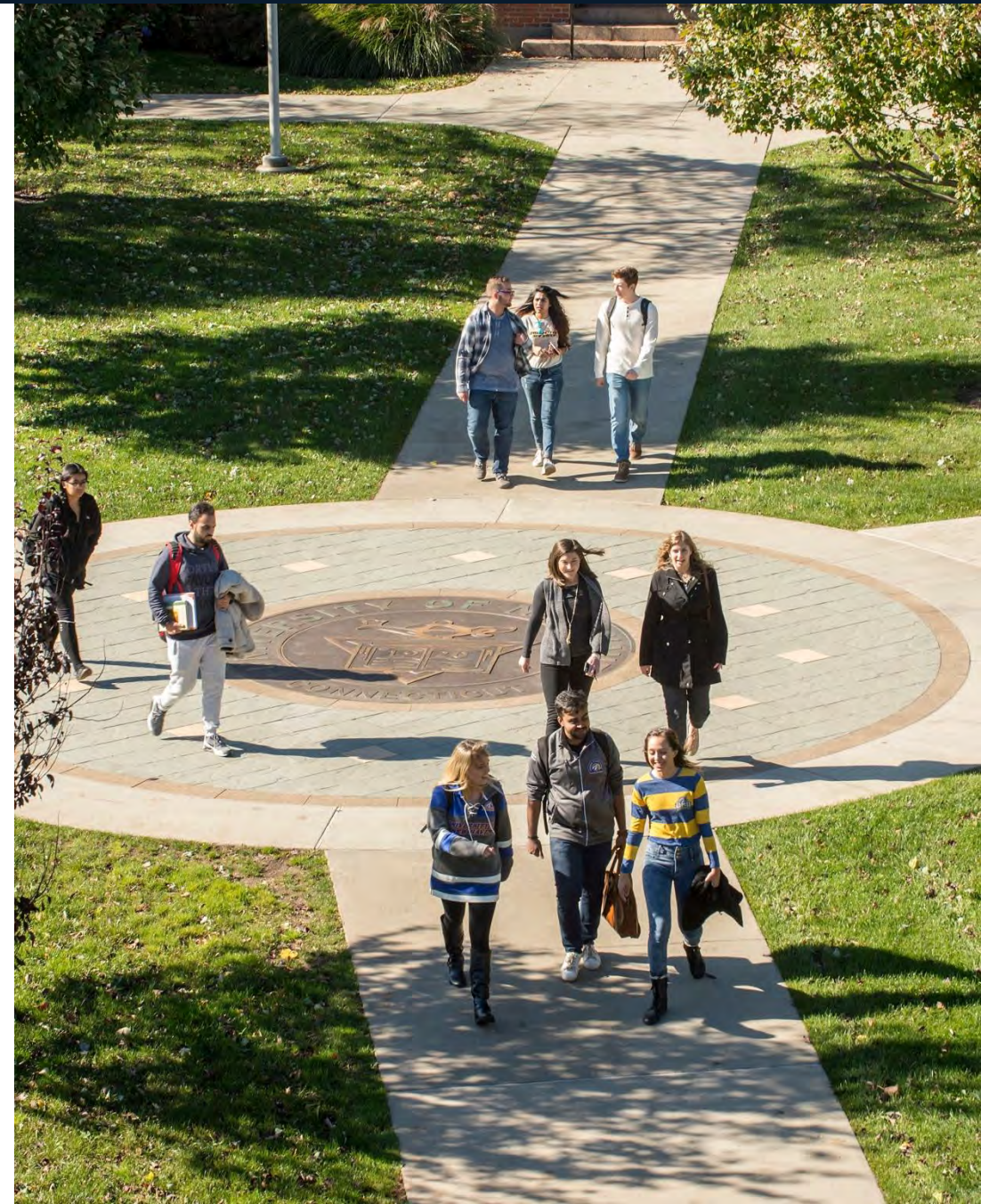
If your student wants to take a FOREIGN LANGUAGE and have some prior exposure to the language, they should take the placement test to get a better idea of their true level.

FIRST (Fostering Intentional Relationships for Successful Transition)

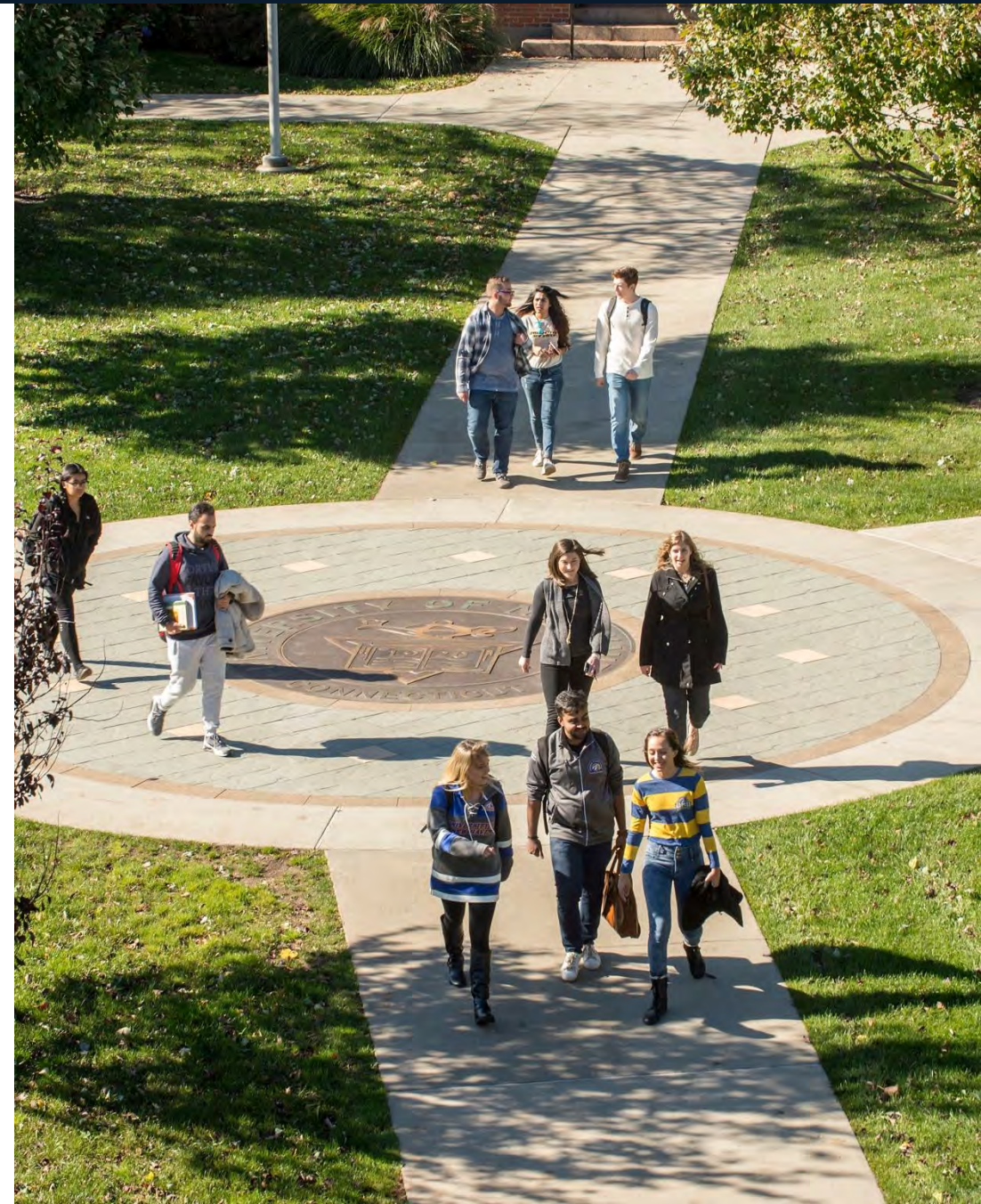
- This program engages a cohort of students during a three-day precollege transition and leadership experience led by fellow students and staff
