Student Success is Important to us!


Encourage them to address any concerns **EARLY**.



EVERY COURSE COUNTS towards either a major requirement or core requirement.


If your student wants to take a FOREIGN LANGUAGE and have some prior exposure to the language, they should take the placement test to get a better idea of their true level.




