Syllabus states the delivery method

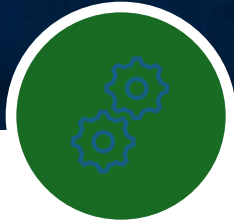
New location – former Allingtown Library will be facilitated by shuttles.

- Monday/ Wednesday classes usually 75 minutes starting at 12:30 pm.



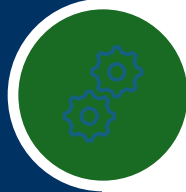
TUESDAY/ THURSDAY

Tuesday / Thursday classes usually 75 minutes starting at 8:00 am.

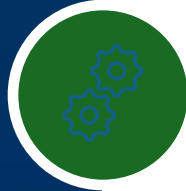
FRIDAY ONLY

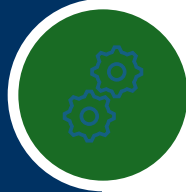


Navigate System – early identification and intervention

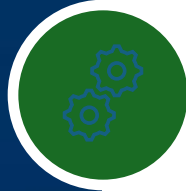
